When Good Things Happen to Bad People

Psalm 73

Surely God is good to Israel, to those who are pure in heart.

²But as for me, my feet had almost slipped; I had nearly lost my foothold.

³For I envied the arrogant when I saw the prosperity of the wicked.

First: Life's unfairness can make us doubt God.

Outwardly

Verse 4: "They have no struggles"

Verse 5: "They are free from common human burdens; they are not plagued by human ills."

Physically

Verse 4: "...their bodies are healthy and strong."

Verbally

Verses 8-9
"They scoff, and speak with malice; with arrogance they threaten oppression.

Their mouths lay claim to heaven, and their tongues take possession of the earth."

Influentially

Verse 10, "Therefore their people turn to them and drink up waters in abundance."

His Dangerous Conclusion

Verse 13, "Surely in vain I have kept my heart pure and have washed my hands in innocence."

Second: Reflecting on God's Word with God's people can restore our faith.

Remedy #1: Consideration of God's People

Verse 15: "If I had spoken out like that, I would have betrayed your children."

Remedy #2: Contemplation of God's Word

Verses 16-17
"When I tried to understand all this, it troubled me deeply
¹⁷till I entered the sanctuary of God; then I understood their final destiny."

Result #1: Confession

Verses 21-22
"When my heart was grieved and my spirit embittered,
²²I was senseless and ignorant; I was a brute beast before you.

Result #2: Profession

Verses 23-26
"Yet I am always with you;
you hold me by my right hand.

24 You guide me with your counsel,
and afterward you will take me into glory.

25 Whom have I in heaven but you?
And earth has nothing I desire besides you.

26 My flesh and my heart may fail,
but God is the strength of my heart
and my portion forever."
